The facility is located near Bungendore NSW (30 min from Canberra) and is not open to the general public.

PPC R&B is currently undergoing an expansion of its facilities, with the establishment of new conservation projects and is seeking an experienced keeper who is passionate about pursuing a career in the field of conservation through captive animal management. The individual must have a positive mature attitude and is able to perform well in a fast-paced environment. The role will include general daily husbandry to a high standard, for both exotic and native species.

- Certificate III in Captive Animals/Bachelor degree in the field of Science or Biology/equivalent.
- Minimum 2 years employment in a keeping or animal husbandry role.
- Capable of lifting up to 15kg.
