- Extensive experience as a veterinarian, preferably with non-domestic species (specifically Koalas), with highly developed diagnostic, clinical pathology, surgical, and microscopy experience.
- Prescribe and administer drugs as required, prepare schedule for nursing team during absences
- Self-motivation, with the ability to prioritise effectively and work successfully under competing deadlines and multiple objectives whilst working autonomously or part of a cohesive team
- Proven excellent communication, interpersonal skills, and ability to react swiftly and appropriately during complex situations, whilst remaining calm and composed
